### IMPORTANT

When you arrive at the Louis Armstrong International Airport: Public transportation does not run between the Airport and the conference center / nearby hotels. Transportation options include:

- SICB has contracted with Airport Shuttle for a discounted (\$24 one-way/\$40 round trip) fare, made online, 24 hrs in advance, through the following link:
